- 2. Deliver higher mitigation and adaptation ambitions.

What NMAs are not/don't do:

- 1. Are not reliant on market-based approaches.
- 2. Do not involve the transfer of any mitigation outcomes.

Are conducted in a manner that respects human rights and the rights of Indigenous peoples

Focus areas

Initial Focus areas

- (a) Adaptation, resilience and sustainability;
- (b) Mitigation measures to address climate change and contribute to sustainable development;
- (c) Development of clean energy sources

Things to consider

- Enhance cooperation
- Avoid duplication
- Avoid burdens
- Do not delay work programme

Identifying existing NMAs

- NMAs can include:
 - Regulations
 - Voluntary Agreements
 - Information, Education and Awareness Programmes
 - Research and Development

- Open call to Parties to submit examples of existing NMAs
 - COP26 alone concluded with approximately 36 Declarations/Initiatives, ranging in issue areas <u>COP26 Outcomes - UN Climate Change Conference</u> (<u>COP26</u>) at the <u>SEC – Glasgow 2021 (ukcop26.org)</u>

Options for enhancement

- Identify linkages across NMAs
- Allow searchable and accessible on NMAs to be available to Parties, private sector, and civil society via the web-based platform
- Share information
- Participate in NMAs on voluntary basis
- GC-NMA to discuss activities, focus areas, and information sharing opportunities
