## **Context – why is authorisation important?**



- Key aspects of authorisation:
  - Pre-requisite to participating in Article 6.2
  - Leads to corresponding adjustments for first transferring Party
  - Triggers reporting of Initial Report
- Important aspect of Article 6.2 cooperation, nationally and internationally...
- Authorisation was mentioned, but not defined, in Article 6.2 guidance from COP26
- ... but is not clear exactly what authorisation applies to, when it occurs, whether needed by the acquiring party

# Information on authorisation needs to be reported




- Reporting is needed via multiple vehicles (initial report, annual information, regular information), multiple years
- But what exact information on authorisation needs to be reported ... and in what format... is not clear (qualitative, as well as quantitative information?)
- Comparability, consistency of content and timing of Party reports would be improved by further clarity on how to interpret authorisation

### Changes to authorisations

- Changes to authorisations are to be reported in Parties' regular information
- Whether changes are needed depends on when in the MO lifecycle authorisation occurs
- Possible changes range from:
  - Administrative changes (no significant impact)
  - Substantive changes (possible impact on ITMO use, number of ITMOs transacted)
- Guidance on how to address which sort of changes would be helpful (c.f. precedent from CDM)





#### **Conclusions**



- Authorisation an important component of A6.2 ... but currently not well defined
- Some aspects of international A6.2 guidance could usefully be clarified e.g. by CMA in the short term :
  - what "authorisation" refers to (and by whom)
  - when authorisation occurs
  - which aspect of authorisation triggers reporting
- This would improve comparability and consistency, facilitate "double book keeping" of corresponding adjustments
- Longer-term guidance on how to address possible changes to authorisations would also be useful
