Work programme under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement and in decision 4/CMA.3

Matters relating to the schedule for implementing the activities of the work programme under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement and in decision 4/CMA.3

[The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement,

Recalling decision 4/CMA.3 and the Paris Agreement,

Noting with appreciation the contributions received from Parties and observers in support of implementing the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement,

1. Welcomes the report¹ of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches that includes progress in and recommendations for implementing the work programme under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement and in decision 4/CMA.3;

I. Schedule for implementing the work programme activities

- 2. Adopts the schedule for implementing the activities of the work programme under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement and in decision 4/CMA.3, for 2023 and 2024, and *takes note* of the indicative activities for 2025–2026, as contained in the table in annex I;
- 3. Requests the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches to continue implementing, in accordance with the schedule in annex I, the work programme activities referred to in chapter V of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3 for 2023–2026, in two phases:
- (a) A first phase (2023–2024) that focuses on identifying and framing all relevant elements of the work programme activities referred to in paragraph 8 of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3;
- (b) A second phase (2025–2026) that focuses on fully implementing the work programme activities referred to in paragraph 3(a) above following a learning-by-doing approach, drawing on inputs from the identification phase, recognizing that some elements can be implemented earlier in the first phase with priority being given to existing NMAs and the operationalization of the UNFCCC web-based platform;
- 4. Also requests the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches to assess progress in and the outcomes of the first phase at its 6th meeting (November 2024) with a view to developing and recommending a schedule for implementing the work programme activities in the second phase, as appropriate, for consideration and adoption by the Conference of the

Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement at its sixth session (November 2024);

II. UNFCCC web-based platform for non-market approaches

- 5. Requests the secretariat to develop and operationalize the UNFCCC web-based platform referred to in paragraph 8(b)(i) of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3 [for recording and exchanging information on NMAs][for registry of needs and provisions of means of implementation] in a user-friendly and accessible manner for Parties participating in NMAs and other non-Party stakeholders, in accordance with standard UNFCCC practices for web-based communications and the specifications referred to in paragraphs 6–16 below;
- 6. Decides that a Party participating in an NMA may, with the concurrence of the other participating Parties [of which there must be more than one], voluntarily submit the following to the secretariat for recording information on the NMA in the UNFCCC web-based platform:
- (a) A description of the NMA and the implementing entities, including their contact information;
- (b) Information on the how NMA addresses the requirements and criteria referred to in paragraphs 2–3 of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3;
- (c) Updates to the information already provided on the NMA, as applicable, including any available reporting on progress in implementing the NMA or any lessons learned or case studies relating to the NMA;
- 7. [Also decides that Parties that intend to identify, develop and implement an NMA to be facilitated under the framework may, with the agreement of the other participating Parties, voluntarily submit the following to the secretariat for recording in the UNFCCC web-based information on the intended NMA:
- (a) A description of the intended NMA and the implementing entities, including their contact information;
- (b) Information on how the NMA will address the requirements and criteria referred to in paragraphs 2–3 of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3;
- (c) A description of the financial, technology and capacity-building support needed to identify, develop and implement an NMA;
- 8. [Further decides that Parties; the entities entrusted with operating the financial mechanism, [including the Global Environment Facility and the Green Climate Fund;] multilateral, bilateral and other public donors; and private and non-governmental organizations that are in a position to do so, may submit to the secretariat, as appropriate,][Invites the operating entities and the other above-mentioned entities to submit to the secretariat] information on financial, technology and capacity-building support available or provided for identifying, developing or implementing NMAs, for recording on the UNFCCC web-based platform;
- 9. *Notes* that recording a proposed NMA or support available on the UNFCCC webbased platform does not create any rights or obligations for any Party or other entity;]
- 10. [Decides that the UNFCCC web-based platform [will][shall] facilitate matching intended NMAs that need financial, technology and capacity-building support with support available by providing and directing information to Parties that have submitted intended NMAs and are seeking support, and Parties and entities that have submitted information on the support available [,including through the mapping of available sources of support];
- 11. [*Requests* the secretariat, subject to the availability of resources, to facilitate matching intended NMAs[;] [with support available by:
- (a) [Providing, at the request of Parties, information on the available sources of support relevant to their intended NMAs[,including in the form of mapping of available sources of support];]

- (b) [Organizing workshops to understand the diversity of intended NMAs and the support available;]
- (c) [Performing matching tasks using algorithms and artificial intelligence systems (e.g. deep search, machine learning) and sending automatic notifications to the relevant nominated contact person with a list of potential matches;]]]
- 12. Further decides that the UNFCCC web-based platform is to [contain an information hub that provides information on available resources and tools, includes links to relevant sites and news, a visualization tool for mapping NMAs [and existing initiatives, programmes and projects, including those that support Parties in meeting the requirements for receiving support and provide capacity-building for implementing NMAs] [and assembling country and multi-country profiles], and a discussion forum that Parties and non-Party stakeholders could access to facilitate networking][and to present information on NMAs, including information identified through implementing the work programme];
- 13. [Requests the secretariat to provide to the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches regular updates on the status of the development and operationalization of the UNFCCC web-based platform [in accordance with the schedule for implementing the work programme]];
- 14. [Also requests the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches to provide the secretariat with additional guidance on the development and operationalization of the UNFCCC web-based platform as required [in accordance with the schedule for implementing the work programme]];
- 15. [Also requests the secretariat to assess the matching process and provide recommendations on how the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches can support the enhancement of the matching facility, in particular through the involvement of entities within and outside the UNFCCC;]
- 16. *Encourages* Parties and [non-Party stakeholders] to submit non-market approaches in the focus areas to the UNFCCC web-based platform once it becomes operational;

III. Additional focus areas of the work programme activities

- 17. Takes note of the diverse range of potential additional focus areas for non-market approaches that may be facilitated under the framework, as identified by Parties and observers in previous rounds of submissions of views, synthesis reports and in-session workshops (see annex II);
- 18. *Invites* Parties and observers to submit via the submission portal² by 28 February 2023 views on how the potential additional focus areas listed in annex II could be clustered under the initial focus areas referred to in paragraph 3 of decision 4/CMA.3;
- 19. *Requests* the secretariat to prepare a technical paper aimed at determining whether the potential additional focus areas listed in annex II could be clustered under the initial focus areas referred to in paragraph 3 of decision 4/CMA.3, form new additional focus areas for non-market approaches that may be facilitated under the framework, or constitute examples of existing non-market approaches, if participating Parties choose to identify them as such, for consideration by the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches at its 3rd meeting (June 2023);
- 20. Requests the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches to identify and recommend additional focus areas for the work programme activities, taking into account the technical paper referred to in paragraph 19 above, for consideration and adoption by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement at its fifth session (November 2023);

IV. Enhanced cooperation on non-market approaches

- 21. Requests the SBSTA Chair, as a convenor of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches, to invite representatives of relevant constituted bodies and under institutional arrangements under or serving the Paris Agreement and/or the Convention, including the Adaptation Fund, the Climate Technology Centre and Network, the Global Environment Facility, the Green Climate Fund, the Local Communities and Indigenous Peoples Platform, the Paris Committee on Capacity-building, the Standing Committee on Finance and the Technology Executive Committee, to a meeting held in conjunction with SBSTA 58 (June 2023) and organized with the assistance of the secretariat, with the aim of enhancing collaboration of the Glasgow Committee with relevant constituted bodies and under institutional arrangements under or serving the Paris Agreement and/or the Convention as necessary, taking into account their respective mandates;
- 22. Requests the secretariat to prepare a technical paper, for consideration by the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches at its 3rd meeting, on possibilities for enhancing engagement with public and private sector stakeholders, including technical experts, businesses, civil society organizations and financial institutions during meetings of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches, taking into account experience and approaches used for enhancing such engagement in other agenda items under the UNFCCC;

V. Cross-cutting matters

- 23. *Encourages* Parties, public and private sector stakeholders and civil society organizations to actively engage in the development and implementation of non-market approaches under the framework;
- 24. [Requests the secretariat to design and, following consultation with Parties, implement a capacity-building programme, including through its regional collaboration centres, to assist Parties, particularly developing country Parties, to identify[, develop and implement] NMAs to be facilitated under the framework;]
- 25. Takes note of the estimated budgetary implications of the activities to be undertaken by the secretariat referred to in this decision and *requests* that the actions called for in this decision be undertaken subject to the availability of financial resources;
- 26. *Invites* Parties to make contributions to the Trust Fund for Supplementary Activities for operationalizing the work programme.
