The main objective of the project “EU Climate Policy and Electricity Market”, which started in January 2023, is to analyse and inform the EU debate on the electricity market reform from climate change policy perspective.

Within the scope of the first part of this project (1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2023), the ERCST team aims at laying the groundwork for analysis and developing a Climate Change lens for Electricity Market Design. This underpinning work will then allow ERCST to analyse, and input into the European Commission (EC) Proposal on the reform of EU Electricity Market Design (EMD), as well as inform the debate following the submission of the EC proposal.

During this meeting, we will present ERCST preliminary findings on how to analyze the interactions between EU climate policies and electricity market, based on the main takeaways of our previous working group consultations and further research undertaken in the meantime.

The analysis will consist of looking at how the provisions of the market design i.e., marginal pricing, forward markets, long term contracts etc., in interaction with EU-ETS and other climate policies, impact (positively or negatively) on the desirable outcomes i.e., short & long-term signals for decarbonization, competitive advantage, affordability and security of supply.

We will also aim at linking the discussion with the ongoing legislative process for reforming the EMD. The European Commission has published its proposals for Electricity Market Reform on March 14.

This meeting will start by a presentation by ERCST which will provide the discussion background. This will be followed by preliminary remarks from the European Commission. Will then follow a panel discussion during which speakers will share their views and provide their opinions on the proposal. Interventions and debate from the audience will take place during the following Q&A session.
