A draft version of the annual electronic format, which Parties are encouraged to test and provide feedback on



TRAINING PROGRAMME

An outline of the training programme was agreed with the intention to develop courses for Article 6 reviewers, with an initial version of training courses planned for the end of 2023



Article 6.4 mechanism - Short history

Post-Paris, Parties extensively negotiated to develop a "rulebook" of the three instruments of its Article 6, but had faced deadlock on some critical issues (e.g., accounting, baseline setting, transition of CDM activities and units), resulting in no-agreement in Katowice (2018) and also in Madrid (2019)

CMA 3 (November 2021):

- Adopted rules, modalities and procedures (RMPs) for the 6.4 mechanism
- Mandated SBSTA and the Supervisory Body to elaborate key principles set out in the RMPs

CMA 4 (November 2022):

- Adopted guidance on the 6.4 mechanism, including elaboration of the processes and key principles
- Mandated SBSTA to work on few remaining aspects of the RMPs, while giving mandates to the Supervisory Body to develop processes for operationalization of the 6.4 mechanism



Work Programme under Article 6 para. 8 of the Paris Agreement

Key outcomes from COP 27

- Agreed on a two-phased schedule for implementing work programme activities;
- Requested the secretariat to develop and operationalize a UNFCCC web-based platform for non-market approaches (NMAs);
- Agreed on means to **enhance networking and collaboration** on non-market approaches;
- Requested the secretariate to include activities related to the work programme in its broader Article 6 capacity-building programme.



Work Programme under Article 6 para. 8 of the Paris Agreement

Requested the secretariat to **develop and operationalize a UNFCCC web-based platform** for non-market approaches

Key functions

Other functions of the webbased platform

- Record and exchange information on NMAs, NMAs seeking support, and information on support available for NMAs
- Facilitate opportunities, by connecting Parties, to identify, develop, and implement NMAs
- Information hub on available resources and tools on NMAs, incl. links to relevant websites and news
- Visualization tool for mapping NMAs
- Discussion forum for Parties and non-Party Stakeholders to facilitate networking among active users
